Prerequisites: successful placement by audition; concurrent enrollment in an assigned University ensemble for all music majors and minors. Lab fee: \$20.00

MUAP 3113 Applied Music Instruction (upper division). One semester hour.

MUAP 3213 Applied Music Instruction (upper division). Two semester hours.

Private instruction for students in the following instruments: bassoon, clarinet, contrabass, cornet, flute, classical guitar, electric bass, euphonium, harp, harpsichord, horn, oboe, organ, percussion, piano, saxophone, trombone, trumpet, tuba, viola, violin, violoncello, or voice. Seminar attendance may be required. May be repeated for credit in accordance with degree plan. Prerequisites: Upper division standing, successful completion of at least two semesters of MUAP 1213 or placement by audition; concurrent enrollment in an assigned University ensemble for music majors and minors. Lab fee: \$20.00

Justification:

- This is a new numbering system designed to simplify the catalog, which has been worked out between the Department of Fine & Performing Arts and the Office of the Registrar and Financial Aid.
- In the current catalog there are 8 different course numbers representing 8 different levels for each instrument, and each a separate set of 8 numbers depending on whether a student

is taking one semester credit hour or two semester credit hours. This is a very confusing system for both students, registrar, financial aid, and advisors. The department, in consultation with the registrars office, wants to streamline the system.

- The proposed system will allow students to take Applied Music Instruction at either lower division or upper division, repeat the course in accordance with the degree plan (6 SCH in one instrument divided between lower and upper divisions).
- Individual instruments will be identified in the course offerings according to different sections (i.e. MUAP 1213 Section 101 cello)
- The same course description is then applicable to all instruments presented above. This change would replace everything in the printed catalog beginning on page 305 under Applied Music (MUAP) through to page 306 where the course descriptions are.
- The deletion / change will NOT affect course MUAP 4005 Senior Performance

General Syllabus

Applied Music Instruction MUAP 1113-4113 and 1213-4213

Course Description

Private instruction for students in the following instruments: bassoon, clarinet, contrabass, cornet, electric bass, euphonium, flute, classical guitar, harp, harpsichord, horn, oboe, organ, percussion, piano, saxophone, trombone, trumpet, tuba, viola, violin, violoncello, or voice. Seminar attendance may be required. May be repeated for credit a maximum of three semesters.

Course Objectives:

- Acquire a knowledge of technique and apply this knowledge to your own practice and performance
- Obtain a concept of musical artistry and beauty and the ability to recognize this type of performance in yourself and others
- To cultivate skills that will expedite the learning of musical literature
- To develop appropriate performance skills

Learning outcomes

Through study at the appropriate level students will

- 1. Develop their technical competency on their instrument
- 2. Acquire advancing skills in artistic expression, appropriate to the level of study and in fulfillment of the requirements for a Jury at the end of the semester
- 3. Learn and gain an increased knowledge of the standard repertoire for their chosen instrument
- 4. Learn new repertoire appropriate to their instrument, skill, technical competency and artistic development
- 5. Be able to present a musical presentation in front of a jury showing their continued development as a musician

Required Texts

Music will be assigned on an individual basis. Students are responsible for procuring music as assigned. Music may be available at the TAMIU bookstore or at the library, and some will be provided by the instructor. If a professor's studio includes a weekly a studio class, textbooks may be assigned for that class.

• Please bring a notebook to document assignments for weekly lessons (and if so, Studio Class). A standard notebook with a spiral binder is sufficient.

Course Requirements

Attendance, Preparation and Participation:

<u>2 Credit Hour Applied Lesson</u> – Each student will receive one sixty-minute private lesson per week and is required to attend Studio Class.

<u>1 Credit Hour Applied Lesson</u> – Each student will receive one thirty-minute private lesson per week, and is required to attend Studio Class.

Attendance: Students should attend all scheduled lessons prepared and on time. If the professor must cancel a lesson, the lesson will be rescheduled and made up. Each professor will have their own particular attendance policy, which can be found in their course syllabus.

Lessons: Preparation for the lesson will require the individual to practice and study. Lesson time should be for making music, learning *technique* and applying that to pieces and exercises. It is not practice time. Students are expected to learn their music outside of the lesson.

Studio Class: Some studios hold weekly studio classes and others do not. If a student's professor does hold a studio class: preparation and participation in Studio Class will require daily practice for the private lesson in addition to written assignments he or she may receive from the faculty in class. Students will be expected to participate in class discussions and exercises, and should be prepared to play between 3-5 times per semester as designated by your instructor. You are expected to attend all studio classes per semester.

Repertoire: Students are required to prepare repertoire as designated by their instructor. All material performed in a studio class must be memorized if possible (sections or single movements of larger works are allowed in studio class).

Music Major/Minor Jury (Long Semesters Only): Music Majors/Minors will perform a final jury for several members of the music faculty. All pieces performed at the jury must be memorized and performance ready. Only *complete* movements or works will be accepted. The entire faculty that is present determines the jury grade. Failing to appear at the Jury will result in an automatic "F" for the jury grade. Nonmusic majors are not required to take a jury.

Grading Criteria

As most of this course is an applied/private lesson, students will be evaluated on the basis of their independent progress and achievements. Grading criteria are listed below:

- Attendance, preparation and participation of assigned repertoire in lessons
- Jury/Recital grade
- Attendance, preparation and participation in studio class (if applicable)

Practice/Practice Facilities

In preparing for lessons students are expected to practice <u>at least twice</u> the length of their weekly lesson per day, and twice this during the summer. Several rooms are available for practice:

- <u>Practice Rooms</u>: Four practice rooms equipped with Boston upright pianos are located next to the Rehearsal Hall. These practice rooms are open to all music students and are currently obtainable on a first-come, first-serve basis. Practice priority goes to music majors, then music minors.
- <u>Rehearsal Hall (FPA 134)</u>: This hall also has a grand piano available for practice when not in use by an instructor.
- <u>Recital Hall</u>: The two Steinway Grand Pianos located in the Recital Hall are to be used for performance only. You may not practice on these pianos unless you get special permission from your instructor. These pianos are to be used by students during studio class, recitals, or by those preparing for a forthcoming recital (for which they still need to obtain permission by a member of the piano faculty).
