With a sound understanding of curriculum and instruction and their major field of study (e.g., Reading, Bilingual Education, or Early Childhood Education), these individuals will be in a much better position to make sound decisions regarding the professional development of educators with whom they work and the academic achievement of the students in their schools and school districts. Finally, a minor in Curriculum & Instruction can provide our graduate students with an additional option to increase their chances for career advancement. For example, an individual earning a Master's degree with a major in Reading and a minor in Curriculum & Instruction would be able to oversee the reading program in a school district as a Professional Reading Specialist after passing the Reading Specialist certification examination. An individual with these qualifications could also serve as a full-time Reading Instructor at a community college.
