Phil 3302: Philosophy of Law

Course Description

An examination and evaluation of some basic principles and practices of Anglo-American law. The course will focus initially on the nuts and bolts of the law and the legal system, and the general areas of philosophy most germane or apropos to the study of law, then on such problems as: the nature and extent of legal liability, strict liability statutes, "Good Samaritan" law (i.e. the legal and moral duty to render aid), the obligation to obey the law, the law of criminal attempts, the legal enforcement of community moral standards, equality and preferential treatment, the justification of punishment and capital punishment, and plea bargaining. We will examine prominent legal cases and their underlying principles, but the emphasis will be on the philosophical analysis and evaluation of the law in these areas. Readings will be drawn from both classical and contemporary sources.

Student Learning Outcomes

- 1. The course will motivate students, most of whom are not philosophy majors or minors, to care about the philosophical issues or problems the law raises and to promote philosophical engagement with the law and legal texts.
- 2. Students will be introduced to the basic principles and practices of Anglo-American law.
- 3. Students will develop and strengthen their analytical and critical thinking skills through careful reading of the assigned materials and engagement in class discussion.
