## CRIMINAL JUSTICE GRADUATE PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All application materials for the Master of Science in Criminal Justice are due by the date provided by the Office of Graduate Studies & Research to be considered for full admission. Students are able to apply and begin their graduate programs in the Fall, Spring, or Summer (to begin the summer, the application materials must be received by the due date for Spring). To be considered for admission to the Master of Science in Criminal Justice, the student must complete the following requirements prior to the application deadline:

- 1. Have completed an application for graduate studies
- 2. Paid application fee (if applicable)
- 3. Submitted transcripts from all attended colleges/universities
- 4. Personal Narrative
- 5. Have earned a 2.5 GPA overall if degree earned within last 5 years or 2.0 GPA if degree was earned outside of last 5 years.
- 6. Have two letters of recommendation from academic or professional sources sent to the Office of Graduate Studies & Research and to the Department of Behavioral, Applied Sciences, and Criminal Justice. Academic letters must come from outside of the Criminal Justice faculty.
- 7. Have submitted scores from the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test.
- 8. Writing Sample of Scholarly work

In addition, the admissions committee may request a personal interview with the applicant.
