Course Title: Language Disorders in Children and Adults

Description: This course is designed to introduce the student to the identification, analysis, and remediation of language disorders in both children and adults. The course introduces the student to these disorders in both the monolingual and bilingual individual. Both developmental and acquired disorders of the language system are introduced.
