One combination -- Communication and Spanish -- is listed separately in the catalog because of the specialized nature of some of the course requirements. Students may choose any other combination of the following disciplines to form a B.A. degree: Communication, English, History, Mathematics, Political Science, Sociology, and Spanish. Students also have the option of choosing other disciplines in which to acquire a double-major, such as Art and Biology or Chemistry and Music, to give but two examples, but such combinations would require that students complete all requirements for a degree in each of the two disciplines.
