HIST 4391 *Problems in World History*. Three semester hours.

A study of the political, social, and cultural development of specific nations or regions of the world from an historical perspective. May be repeated when the topic changes. May be taken for graduate credit.

Justification:

This description change better reflects the current purpose of this course. Also, this will allow upper-division students the ability to take this special topics course more than once when the subject matter changes. They will therefore have more exposure to the expertise areas of the assigned instructors. This change should be retroactive, so that students who already have HIST 4391 on their transcripts may take the new versions in the future and have all of their HIST 4391 credits count separately toward their degree.
