Designed to be taken at the beginning of work on the major, the class will consider a number of important topics in the research and writing of history. Emphasis will be given to issues such as how historians find and examine evidence, how they pose questions, and how they reach answers to those questions.

-Prerequisite: HIST 1301/1302.

-Justification: The new course is intended to give history majors and minors a better grounding in historical methodologies and writing in order to prepare them for advanced studies in history. This course will be designated as writing-intensive (WIN). The course will address many of the deficiencies we see in our students' writing, and will also provide a basis for pretesting history majors at the beginning of their upper-division coursework.

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History 3303: Historical Methods (WIN designated) Proposed for Fall 2010

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES: This course is designed to give history majors and minors a grounding in the methodologies that professional historians utilize in their scholarship. Intended to be one of the first courses taken in upper-division history, the class will consider a number of important topics in the research and writing of history. Emphasis will be given to issues such as how historians find and examine evidence, how they pose questions, and how they reach answers to those questions. As a writing-intensive course (WIN), the class will emphasize the practical application of students' interpretive skills utilizing a variety of sources and in a variety of contexts. Readings and classroom debate will further prepare students for their upper-division history courses and for critiquing various historiographical debates. Students will also write a major research paper to broaden their own knowledge and that of the class.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify some of the most important types of historical sources and demonstrate competence in their use and analysis.
- 2. Discuss and explain the how the availability and analysis of sources shapes historians' perspectives on the past.
- 3. Critique contemporary debates about various issues in historiography, the scholarship of historical research.
- 4. Develop written arguments in a variety of formats (e.g., primary source analyses, chapter summaries, book reviews, research paper).
