PSYC 5199-5699 Graduate Research One-Three-Six Hours

This course enables students to engage in research on a topic related to psychological inquiry.. Research topic is chosen by the student with the approval of the professor prior to registration. Course may be repeated but not to exceed 12 semester hours. Hours do not count towards the student's major degree plan. Prerequisite: Graduate standing, PSYC 5320 or permission of instructor and department chair.

Justification: Provide graduate students with the opportunity to explore research interests and to acquire additional research experience and be able to work in close collaboration with other graduate students and psychology faculty. The psychology discipline has no other mechanism or class to offer graduate students the necessary tools to explore and learn about the psychological research process.

Learning Objectives:

- 1) Demonstrate application of research methodology to research design in correlational or experimental research
- 2) Demonstrate application of research methodology techniques regarding data collection and running participants in correlational and experimental research
- 3) Make sufficient progress toward substantial progress (to be determined by instructor) toward meaningful collaboration and coauthorship on academic publications or presentations in the field.
