JUSTIFICATION: ARTS 3353 (an art-history course on Contemporary Art and theory) is a current degree requirement in ARTA, along with two additional upper-level courses in art history as electives, for a total of 9 SCH in art history. We propose to eliminate 3353 as a specific requirement, and instead require that all 9 SCH in art history be chosen by the individual ARTA major as electives (with 3353 as one of those potential electives). The reason is that a course in contemporary art and theory is not necessarily that relevant to students aiming to teach at the presecondary level, or at least not as relevant as it would be to majors in the ART track, or to ARTA majors aiming to teach at the secondary level.
