Description ~~A survey of China, India, and Japan from the earliest peoples to the formation of the classical civilizations; the great philosophical and religious systems of Asia; impact of European and American cultures; and the rise of nationalism and Asian transformations since 1914.~~ This course is a survey of the continent's history from earliest pre-colonial times to the eve of European colonial conquest, focusing on diversity and change in African societies. Themes include the development of pre-colonial technology and trade, state formation and Africa's incorporation in the growing world economy.

Justification: These changes reflect a more updated, flexible, and realistic definition of and approach to this course to align with the best practices of our discipline nationally. The change of course number allows for a more logical sequencing of the upper division world history courses, given the addition of new courses.
