Description This is the required capstone course for graduating history majors and minors to bring together many of the ideas and skills which they have learned during their coursework in history. The class will focus on an overview of historiography, the scholarship of historical writing. The course will emphasize the broader themes of world history and their impacts on different eras and groups of people. Professional applied skills of historians such as research, presentation, and writing in multiple formats will be a part of the course. May not be substituted for any other course without written permission from the department chair.

Student Learning Objectives: By the end of the course, students will:

1. Demonstrate knowledge of major schools of historiographical thought.
2. Discuss orally and in writing many of the broader themes of world history.
3. Demonstrate proficiency in critical thinking through the analysis of a variety of historical sources.
