Description _____ An advanced special topics course offered for both WIN and Honors credit, this course will feature an depth cross-disciplinary study of a topic or a defined historical period in world history. Readings will typically be drawn from more than one area of human knowledge, areas as diverse as art, anthropology, religion, science, philosophy, history, music, literature, psychology, and political and social theory. Depending on the topic, the course may be cross-indexed with an appropriate discipline and count for credit in the major. May be repeated once for credit when the topic changes. Prerequisite: "B" or higher in ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, or 2333.

Learning Objectives:

1. Devise and express a well-organized, interesting, and informed oral presentation on a topic of relevance to the special topic of the course.

2. Synthesize an effectively persuasive critical paper with an original thesis that draws from one or more primary texts relative to the special topic of the course and is supported by secondary research.

3. Explain both orally and in writing the major concepts and supporting facts of the special topic for the course.

Prerequisite "B" or higher in ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, or 2333.
