Justification: THAR 1310 is being completely revamped with a new title and new content (and therefore a new description). More in line with surveying all aspects of theatre arts, this course will serve as an introduction to theatre students as well as an appreciation course for all students seeking core credit in the visual, literary, and performing arts. This course will focus less on performance and more on appreciation for all aspects of the theatrical arts.

#### THAR 1310 Performance.

Fundamentals of theatrical performance. Excercises designed to enhance physical and emotional identities, powers of observation, sense memory, emotion memory, sources of vocal production, physical expressiveness and improvisational techniques.

#### Change to:

### **THAR 1310 Theatre Appreciation.**

Survey of all phases of theatre including its history, critical analysis, dramatic works, stage techniques, production procedures, and relation to the fine arts. Participation in major University productions may be required.
