Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs):

The students who complete this course will be able to:

- 1. Understand basic music concepts, in order to read, perform and/or compose music.
- 2. Present one assignment based on a simple musical analysis, which includes the composer's background, form and analysis, cultural influence, and any special performance techniques.
- 3. Sing with a partner during a mixed-clef sight singing/reading training, read multiple clefs, and cooperate with other singers at the same time.
- 4. Discuss and develop personal critiques based on different cultural influences after attending a concert.

Critical Thinking:

Each student will complete one assignment that demonstrates their ability to integrate musical elements learned in the course, including: aural training, theory and basic piano techniques. Each student will select a musical work and provide an analysis with their own personal opinion based on the composers' background, cultural influences and formal analysis. Each student will receive a copy of the anthology at the end of the course; an extra copy will be filed as an assessment artifact for this particular Core Curriculum Objective. This assignment will be scored with a university-wide rubric on critical thinking. The rubric assessment scores will be submitted to the university-wide assessment committee, along with random samples of students' work.

Communication Skills:

Students will present the same assignment as above to the entire class showing its harmonic analysis, as well as lead the class in singing the melody line using predetermined techniques. All student oral presentations and live performances will be videotaped and a copy of the recording will be kept as an assessment artifact for this particular Core Curriculum Objective. This assignment will be scored with a university-wide rubric on communication skills. The rubric assessment scores will be submitted to the university-wide assessment committee, along with random samples of student work.

Teamwork:

Students will successfully demonstrate teamwork through an aural training practice assignment. Students will form teams in groups of three and help each other complete the assignment by listening to, playing with, and critiquing each other. The University Teamwork assessment rubric will be used to assess student's individual contributions and each other's contributions toward the completion of the group assignment. This assignment will be scored with a university-wide rubric on teamwork. The rubric assessment scores will be submitted to the university-wide assessment committee, along with random samples of student work.

Social Responsibility:

Students will attend one live concert and write a concert report that will discuss program design, coordination of staging, feedback from the audience, and multicultural influences. Selected concert reports will be scored with a university-wide rubric on social responsibility. The rubric assessment scores will be submitted to the university-wide assessment committee, along with random samples of student work.
