EDYC 4335 Cognitive Psychology & Early Learning (WIN) 3 Credit Hours

This course focuses on the application of concepts and findings from cognitive psychology to teaching practices in early learning settings. Emphasis is on using existing research findings in attention, memory, language, and thinking to improve the effectiveness of instructional design. EDYC 4335 is designated as a "Writing Intensive" (WIN) course in which writing will play a central role in the learning process, and in which grades earned on written work will constitute a significant portion of the course grade. Prerequisites: EDYC 2324, 3362, 3366, admitted to and in good standing in the College of Education. <u>(E)</u>

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. The candidate explains the major components of human cognition and cognitive processes with the conceptual frameworks commonly used in cognitive psychology.
- 2. The candidate elaborates on the major factors that affect young children's learning from a cognitive psychology perspective.
- 3. The candidate applies cognitive psychology theories and concepts to instructional design to maximize young children's learning.

Justification:

This course is a required course in the new Early Learning program (Non-Certification). The EDYC prefix ("young children") is used for all courses in the major. The course provides an introduction of the major theories and concepts in cognitive psychology as they apply to classroom instruction for children from birth to age six.
