COMM 5301 Communication Theories

Course description

The course provides a survey and critical examination of the main theoretical approaches in the fields of mass, international and organizational communication. The course is intended to acquaint students with the conceptual foundations and epistemological bases of the three basic areas available in the graduate program in communication.

Learning outcomes

- 1. The students will analyze and compare the different theoretical approaches prevailing in the fields of mass, international and organizational communication.
- 2. The students will analyze and compare the different methodological strategies and techniques used by the different theoretical approaches in the empirical inquiry of communication processes.
- 3. The students will apply theoretical concepts in the analysis of media and organizations in the border and the inter-American contexts.

Course purpose

The purpose of this course is to introduce the current contemporary debates within communication theories scholarship, reinforce the most fundamental theoretical concepts and constructs in the scientific field of communication and apply them creatively in the analysis of communication phenomena in contemporary societies.

Prerequisites: Graduate standing. This is a required course for any student enrolled in the graduate program in Communication.

Class format:

Class will consist of a mixture of lecture, discussion and in class activities. Active participation in class is strongly encouraged. Students will also find and analyze research articles recently

published in major communication academic journals. They will read extensively seminal texts in communication theories and will be required to write a final paper applying theoretical communication concepts to relevant contemporary issues and phenomena. Students will be strongly prompted to present their final papers in academic conferences.
