PADM 5301 Advanced Methods of Social Research

Three semester hours.

This course introduces the student to the essentials of conducting social science research. Students will be introduced to the different dimensions of social research: ethics, theory, hypothesis testing, research design, sampling, measurement, and quantitative data analysis. Students will also become familiar with using SPSS, a common statistical software package. By the end of the course students will possess the foundation to begin applying this knowledge to real world applications- in academia, government, non-profit, or private industry. Prerequisite: PSCI 3301, CRIJ 3305, SOCI 3305, or similar undergraduate coursework in social scientific research methods, or permission of instructor. (Cross-listed with CRIJ 5320 and PSCI 5301)

Justification: This is not a new course; we are adding a PADM prefix for student convenience. Now that the MPA program is entirely online, the change to a PADM prefix will reduce confusion among our students when searching for PADM course offerings each semester via UConnect. Many students do not realize when looking at the required courses that this class has a PSCI identifier. It is important that they can locate this class easily as it is one of two classes that students are required to take during their first Fall semester in the program.
