ENGL 3301

<u>Current Description</u>: ENGL 3301: Writing Across the Disciplines Three Semester hours. (FL/SP/SS)

This course provides practice in writing from a multi-disciplinary perspective. Students will have the opportunity to write position papers, proposals, reviews, abstracts, informative reports, laboratory reports, case studies, and field observations and to design web-based projects germane to their specific major or to the discipline specified in the course descriptor. Prerequisite: ENGL 1302 or equivalent course.

Revised Description: ENGL 3301: Writing in the Disciplines--WIN

Three semester hours. (SS/FL) WIN designated and On-line.

This course provides opportunities for students to write in various disciplinary areas, including but not limited to, Fine and Performing Arts, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Humanities. Students engage in the writing process and compose a number of writing projects that meet the expectations of a given genre and discipline, including, but not limited to, visual analysis, critical analysis, and argument-synthesis. Research and critical reading, writing, and thinking are emphasized. Prerequisite: <u>ENGL 1302</u> or equivalent course.

- 2. Critically analyze readings from a variety of disciplines;

- 5. Use appropriate, discipline-specific citation format and document design;
- 6. Create a final product that is fully developed in content, attentive to audience needs, and exhibits proofreading expertise
