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Foreign Language Requirement: Students seeking an undergraduate degree from admission to Texas A&M International University must demonstrate beginning college-level proficiency in one a foreign language. The College of Arts and Science has additional language requirements for the BA degree.

Beginning Proficiency is defined as the equivalent of 6 college level semester credit hours (SCH) of a foreign language. College-level proficiency may be demonstrated by:

- 1 completion of three years of high school study of a single foreign language with a minimum grade of 80 (3.0) at the end of the third year, **or**
- completion of two years of high school study of a single foreign language and completion of a 2000 level university course in the same language with a "C" or better, or
- a earning a minimum grade of "C" in 6 SCH in one a foreign language, or
- 4 completion of an approved international experience (study abroad) of at least one semester/summer session in length or
- 5 CLEP or AP exam scores that award 6 SCH in one a foreign language, or
- 6 completion of two foreign language courses in -a foreign language with a "C" or better from the University's International Language Institute, or
- 7 completion of two American Sign Language courses with a "C" or better.

Foreign language course credits may be used to fulfill, in part, the institutional option of the University Core Curriculum, the second Romance language requirement for the B.A. in Spanish or certain lower-level general electives in other degree. In some degree programs, however, the foreign language may count as additional credits above and beyond those required for the degree.

International students who have completed their academic studies in a language other than English will have met the foreign language requirement.
