This course explores diverse topics in British and/or British colonial literature from the dawn of the Enlightenment (eighteenth century) to the present day—effectively, the period of Britain's emergence as a world power and of its literary products' status as world literature. Topics vary, such as intense examination of textual depictions of Britain's engagement with scientific discovery and exploration; of the rise and fall of the Empire and the management thereof; of the roles of women and colonized "Others;" and of Britain's place in the world today. Course may be repeated when the topic changes.

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. identify works of poetry and prose, fiction and non-fiction, and drama, that are generally understood to be representative of a particular period or movement (depending on the course focus) in British literature from c. 1700 to the present;
- 2. analyze the cultural, social, and historical aspects of these various works;
- 3. perform close readings of the various texts;
- 4. make connections between writers, writings, and themes; and
- 5. compose texts that effectively address purpose, style, and content. (This includes: clear focus, structurally unified development of ideas, appropriate rhetorical style and visual style, correct use of Standard American Academic English [SAAE], and appropriate and ethical use of primary and secondary sources.)
