DIRW 0301 0401 Integrated Reading and Writing. Three Four semester hours.  An integrated approach to the teaching of developmental reading and writing, this course introduces the foundation reading and writing strategies and skills necessary for success in college level content courses through application of these in relevant academic content areas. Students completing this course successfully will earn University credit be not credit toward graduation.
Rationale: In 2014, The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board mandated that the highest level of developmental in reading and writing has to be merged into one integrated class. This meant that our curriculum for six SCHs as previously taught had to be covered in one 3 SCH course. After one year of implementation it is clear that students must spend more time on task in the classroom to raise their level of preparedness for college level classes. Other institutions have done similar modification to offset the reduced student contact time with instruction
