Graduate Admissions Formula*

To meet the minimum admissions requirement, the following formula is used:

$$(\text{Upper Level GPA} \times 100) + \text{GRE Verbal} + \text{GRE Quantitative}$$

Applicants with formula scores **above 660** will be **fully admitted** into their graduate program.

Applicants with formula scores **between 659 and 575** will be admitted to their graduate program under **Probationary Admissions** status.

Applicants with formula scores below 575 will be holistically reviewed by the department or program admissions committee.

All ~~other~~ admissions to graduate programs is through departmental or college/school admission committees. The student's entire record will be considered including the completed application for admission, undergraduate overall GPA, upper level GPA, GPA in the discipline, a student narrative, letters of recommendation, GRE or GMAT scores (evaluated in compliance with HB 1641), and professional and/or academic experience.
