





7. TAMIU GPA: Have a TAMIU GPA of 2.75. Students desiring entry into Communication Disorders undergraduate or certificate programs must have a TAMIU GPA or an undergraduate GPA of 3.0.

8. Foreign Language Requirement: Meet the University's Foreign Language graduation requirement. This may be demonstrated by:

- a. completion of three years of high school study of a single foreign language with a minimum grade of 80 (3.0) at the end of the third year,  
or
- b. earning a minimum grade of "C" in 6 SCH in one foreign language,  
or
- c. CLEP or AP exam scores that award 6 SCH in one foreign language,  
or
- d. completion of two foreign language courses in one language with a "C" or better from the University's International Language Institute,  
or
- E. completion of two American Sign Language courses with a "C" or better.

9.. The TOEFL IBT is required of all students having academic studies from a country where English is not the native language. A minimum TOEFL IBT score of 26 in each of the four areas (reading, listening, speaking and writing) is required for admission to the College of Education.

**Justification:**

TEA during its last site visit recommended that 98 be our minimal score on this section of the Accuplacer. The Accuplacer was implemented for 2014 fall admissions for the first time; to date the highest score reached is a 96 (a business major). None of the students who took the Reading portion have passed with a score of 98 or higher. The maximum score is 120. If we continue with the 98, we will probably not have any new undergraduate students admitted to the College. From a quick request of other TX institutions (n=13 responses) regarding the use of Accuplacer, 8 have a score much lower than ours. (Five institutions do not use the Accuplacer.) The range of the scores from the 8 institutions is from 78 to 84. Our peer institutions (Kingsville; A&M, SA) have a minimum score of 78, as does Lamar, Texas Tech, and Tarleton. UNT-Dallas and TWU have a minimal score of 80; Wayland Baptist's minimal score is 84. We uncovered that the state acceptable minimum score is a 78. Observational data from the Testing Center suggests that our students' scores gather around the 80s.

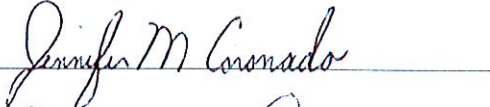
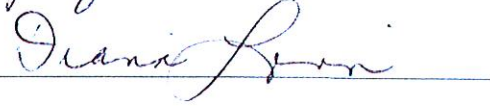
