Title: Beginning German I & II

Measurable Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Express orally in the target language at the Novice-mid sublevel as defined by ACTFL (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages).
- 2. Use simple grammatical structures at the sentence level in speaking and writing.
- 3. Recognize the general principles and/or patterns in language structures.
- 4. Demonstrate general knowledge of countries where the target language is spoken.
- 5. Identify appropriate use of the language according to the cultural and situational context in which it is spoken.
- 6. Dramatize everyday situations in the target language.
- 7. Express an understanding of the language awareness topics presented in class.

SCH Value: 6

Description: German 1620 is an introduction to the German language and German-speaking cultures. The course focuses on the development of basic communication skills in German. It is designed to develop the four language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

Prerequisite: None

Justification: This course provides COAS students the opportunity to achieve their 6 SCH language requirement in one semester by combining GERM 1311 and 1312 into a four-day per week format.
