

Pharmacy Technician Program

About the Program

Texas A&M International University 's Office of Continuing Education Pharmacy Technician training program consists of 84 hours of classroom study, with an additional 120-hour internship. The program offers students both theoretical and practical training through hands-on experience, preparing students for entry-level positions in the retail and institutional pharmacy setting.

How to Register

Admission to the program is based on a review of the application and interview with the student. In order to complete the application and be considered for admission, students must:

- Complete all registration, enrollment, and student agreement forms
- Provide high school transcripts, GED scores, or college transcripts
- Submit to a complete background check. Applicants who have been convicted of any felony or drugrelated crime will not be admitted to the program.

Additional prerequisites include:

- Basic computer, algebra, and typing skills (25-30WPM)
- Commitment to a rigorous course schedule.
