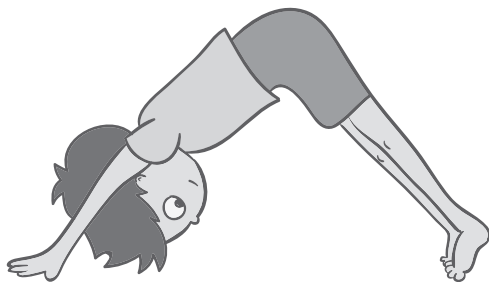
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GREEK FOR A WEEK

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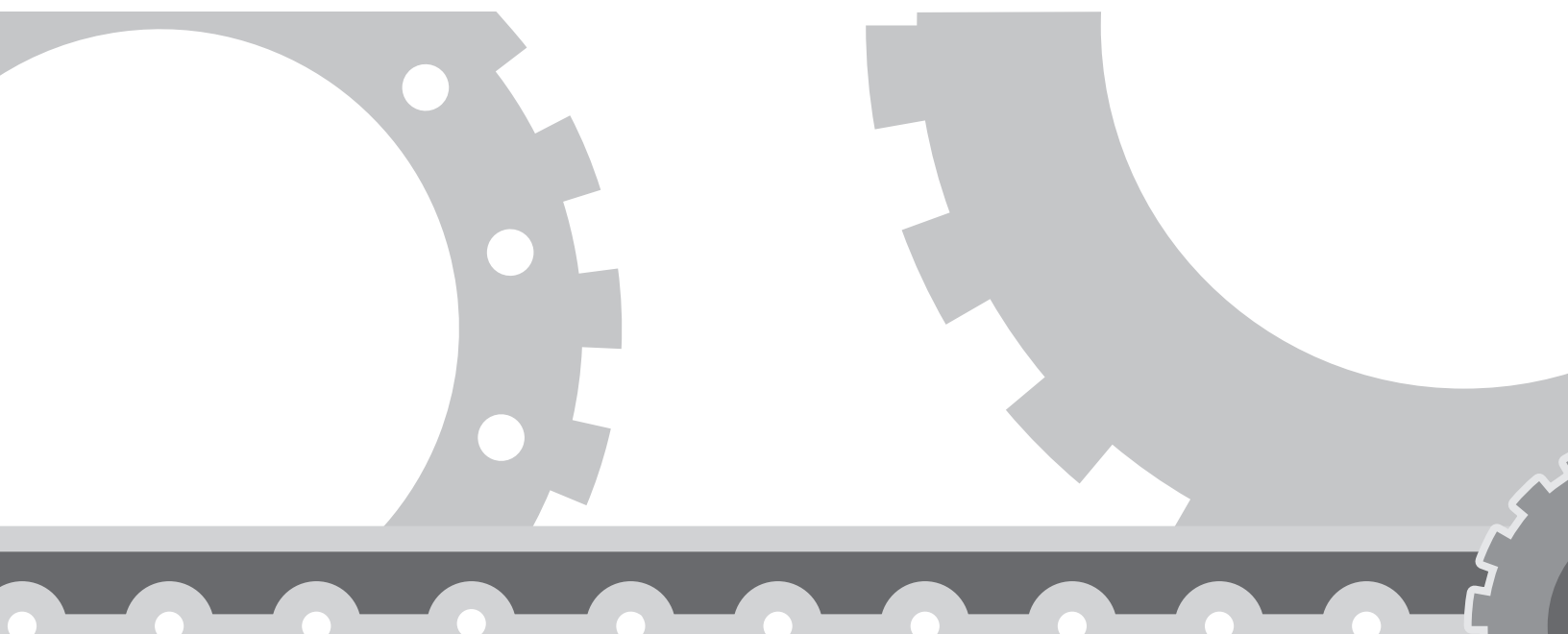
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AN AUTHOR A DAY/CREATIVE WRITING

LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

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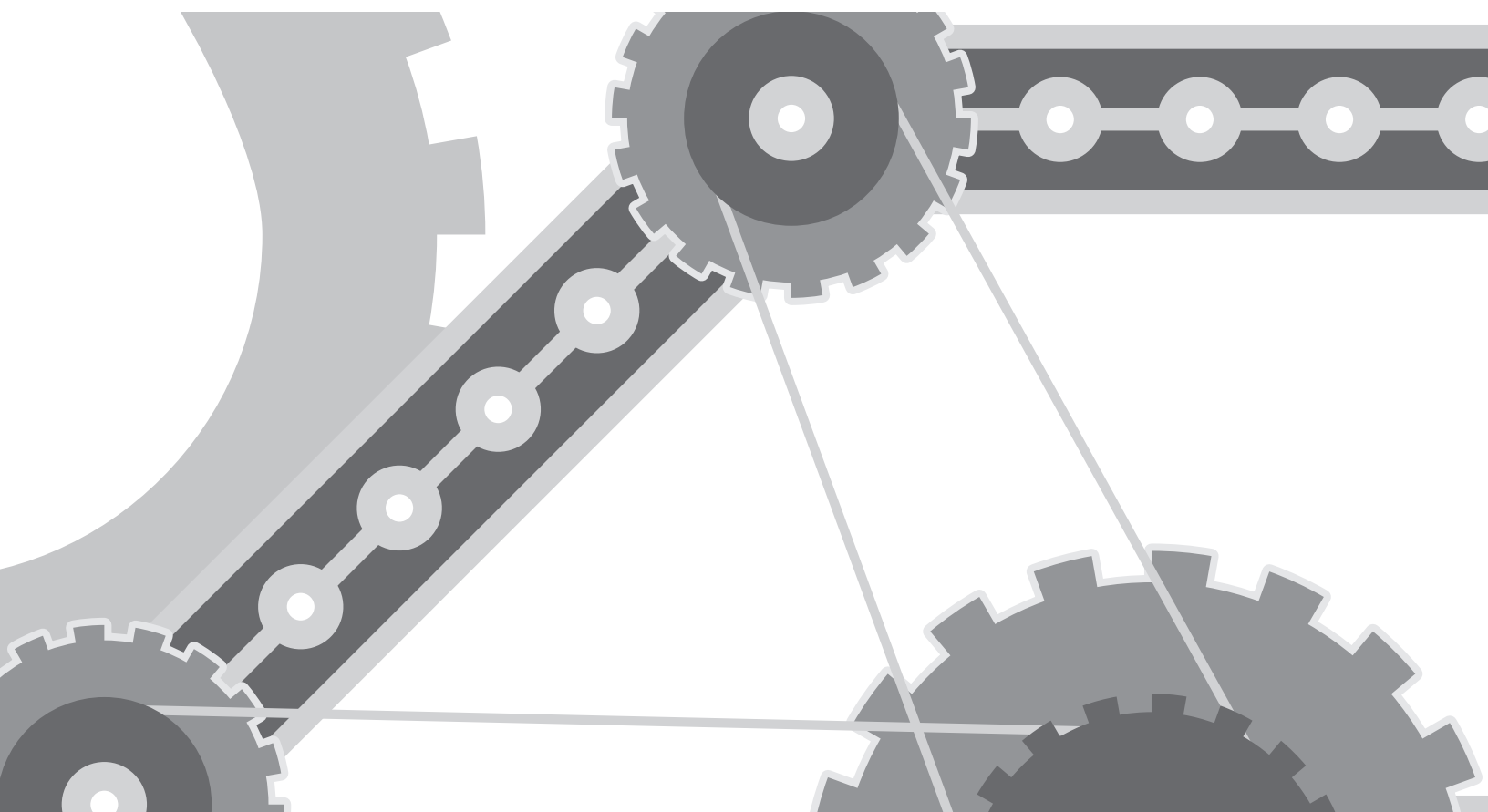
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ALGEBRA BOOT CAMP

GRAMMAR 101

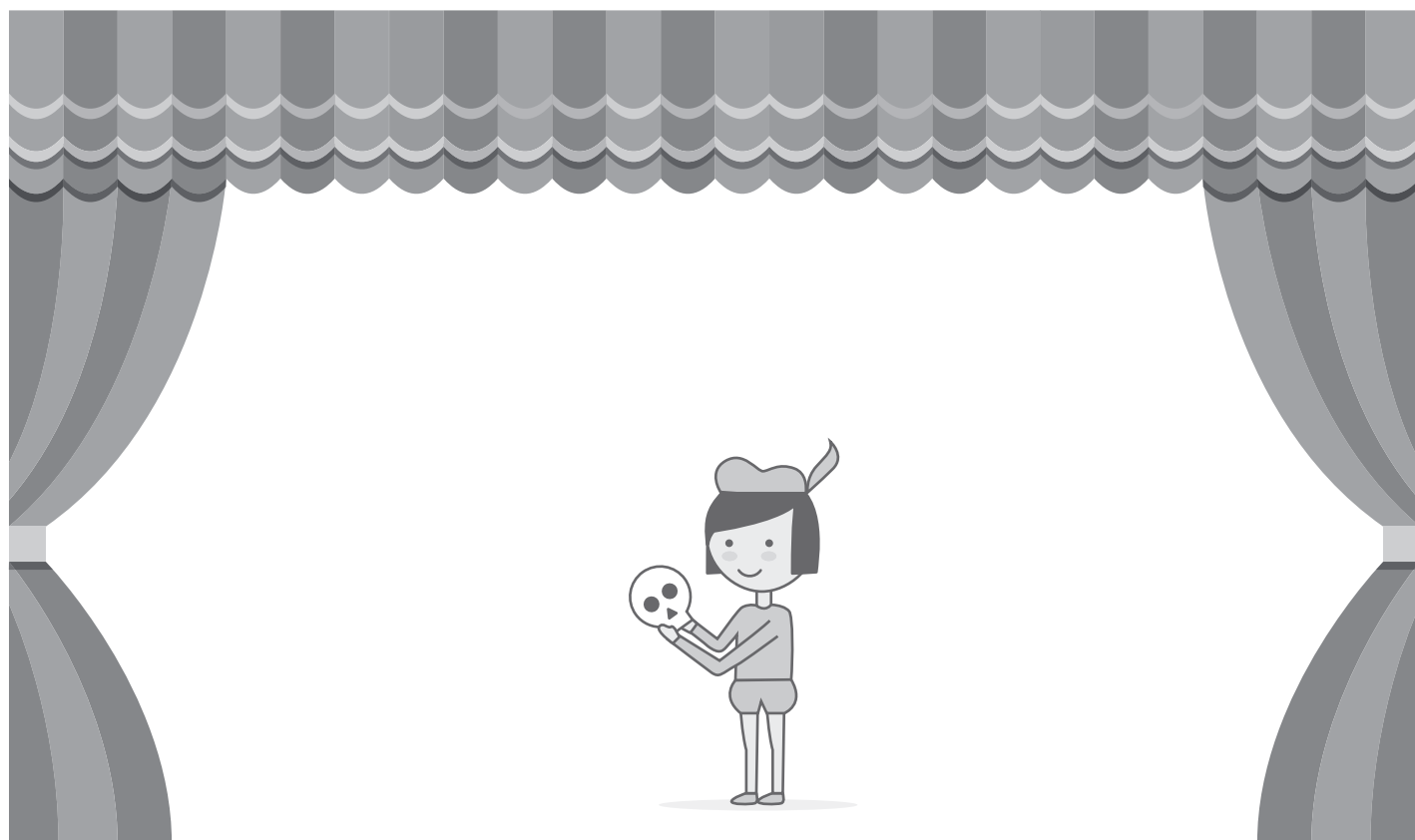
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SAT VOCABULARY

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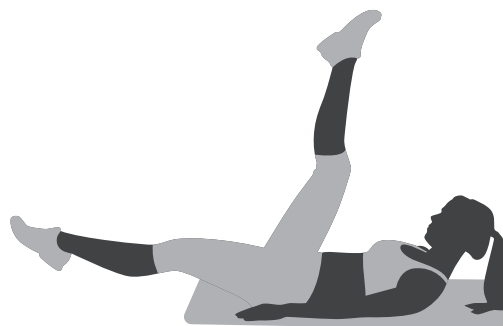
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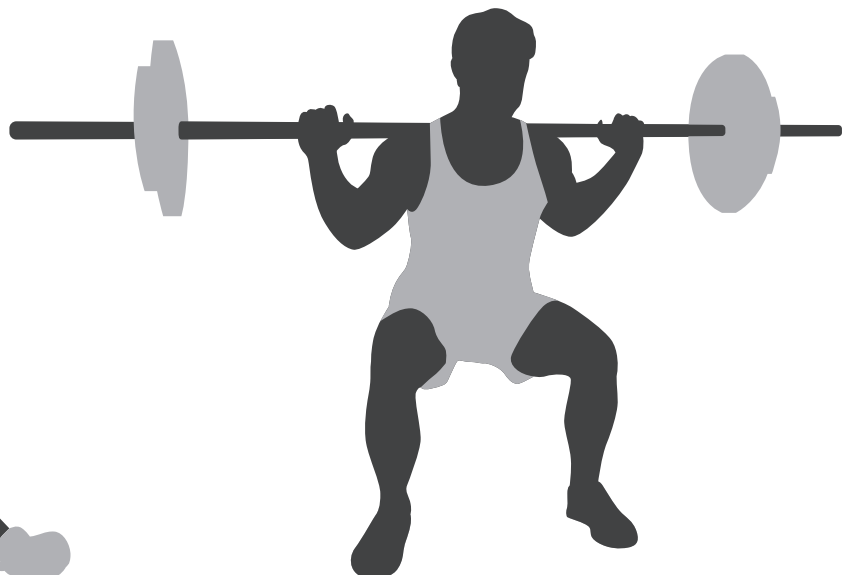

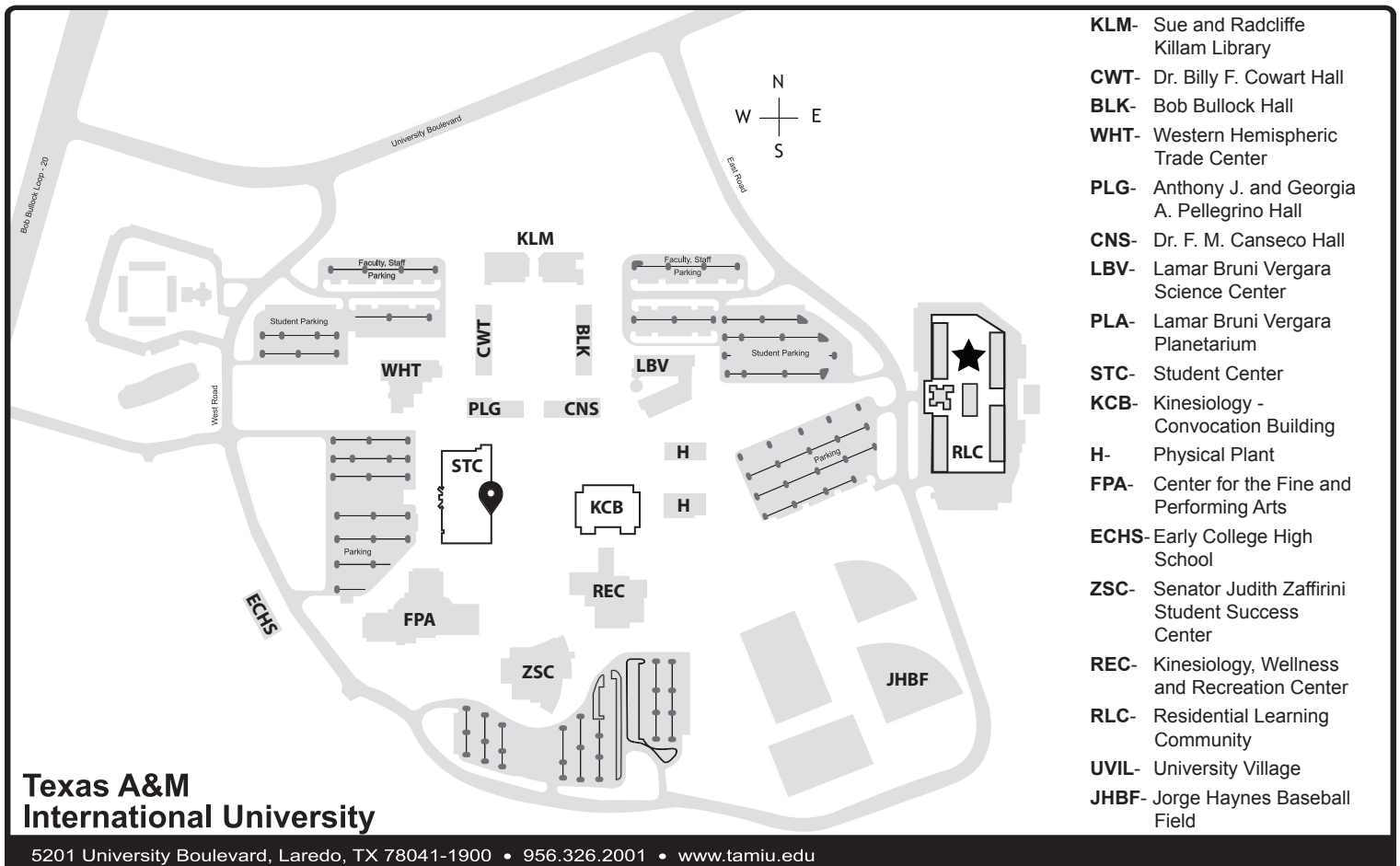
