What Do Audiologists Do?

They are healthcare professionals who provide patient-centered care in the prevention, identification, diagnosis, and evidence-based treatment of hearing, balance, and other auditory disorders for people of all ages. They work in ENT offices, hospitals, and private practice. They hold a Clinical Doctoral degree in

What Do Speech-Language Pathologists Do?

They work to prevent, assess, diagnose, and treat speech, language, social communication, cognitive-communication, and swallowing disorders in children and adults. They work in schools, hospitals, private practice, rehab centers and homehealth. They hold a Masters degree in Communication Sciences & Disorders.

What Do SLP & Audiology Assistants Do?

They perform a variety of duties that may include cleaning and preparation of equipment, limited documentation, routine therapeutic activities as deemed appropriate by the licensed supervisor, and other duties not otherwise limited by the scope of practice, education, or aptitude of the individual. They work in schools, homehealth, private clinics and medical offices. They hold a Bachelors degree in Communication Sciences & Disorders. They must be supervised by a licensed Speech-Language Pathologist or Audiologist.

What Do Speech, Language, & Hearing Researchers Do?

They focus on the normal functions of human communication, the process underlying impaired function, and the development of new techniques for assessment and treatment. Their research generates the evidence on which clinical practice is based. They work in institutions of higher learning, research laboratories, state and federal government agencies and private industry. They hold a Masters or Doctoral degree in Speech, Language & Hearing Research.
