How to become an Elementary Teacher with emphasis on English as a Second Language Learners

What Do Elementary School Teachers Do?

Elementary school teachers instruct young students in basic subjects, such as math and reading, in order to prepare them for future schooling. In both Laredo school districts, elementary teachers are required to be certified.

Eligibility v Admission:

Eligibility does not guarantee admission into a program. Candidates apply for admission into the program while taking EDCI 3324. Candidates with C's in lower division Math, Science, English, or Social Studies may not be admitted.

Pay:

- In the 2016-2017 school year, teachers with Laredo Independent School District averaged salaries of \$55k.
- In the 2016-2017 school year, Teachers with United Independent School District averaged salaries of \$54K.
- Nationally, elementary teachers averaged \$55k per year as of 2016.

Job Outlook:

During the 2016-2017 school year, Laredo Independent School District hired 45 new teachers. United Independent School District hired 70 new teachers for that year.

Elementary teachers who graduate without Bilingual certification will be limited in job opportunities to private, parochial, and charter schools, or school districts outside of Laredo.

Required Clinical Experience:

After admission into COED, all students will be required to complete clinical experience in a school each semester.

Block IA (Junior Year, Fall Semester):

- 4 hours per week for 10 weeks at a school during school hours.

Block IB (Junior Year, Spring Semester)

- 4 hours per week for 10 weeks at a school during school hours.

Block II (Senior Year, Fall Semester):

- 7 hours per week for 11 weeks at a school during school hours.

Block III (Senior Year, Spring Semester):

- 1 week of pre-service at TAMIU. 40 hours per week for 12 weeks at a school during school hours.

Certifications Required:

- *Required:* Core Subjects EC-6 (Junior Year, Fall Semester). Must pass to progress in the program. Core Subjects PPR (Senior Year, Spring Semester.) Must pass to be recommended for certification.
- *Strongly Recommended:* ESL Certification
