Decision-making is the cognitive process of selecting a course of action from multiple alternatives. Fuzzy decision-making originates from the ideas proposed by Zadeh, who introduced the concepts of fuzzy constraints, fuzzy objective and fuzzy decision. Fuzzy decision-making deals with nonprobabilistic uncertainty and vagueness in the environment in which the decision-making takes place. Fuzzy set approaches to decision-making are usually most appropriate when human evaluations and the modeling of human knowledge are needed. A rational approach toward decision-making should take human subjectivity into account, rather than employing only objective probability measures.
