

Our Program Structure

We teach required courses, including: Public Budgeting, Administrative Ethics, Administrative Law, Policy Development, Program Evaluation, Communication, Human Resources Management, and Organization Theory, etc.

Our program requires you to complete 42 credit hours of graduate work, including a core curriculum of 11 courses (33 hours) and three elective courses (9 hours). While we teach most courses on campus, some online courses are available on a semester-by-semester basis. You will be able to complete our program in about two years (if enrolled full-time) or less than three years (if enrolled part-time).

Our full-time faculty have Ph.D.s in their areas of expertise, are nationally and internationally recognized, dedicated to improving the quality of public service, and attentive to your needs. They are equally committed to providing your professional development needs while fostering future generations of public service scholars, leaders, and managers.

Our MPA program is flexible enough to accommodate your work schedule: Courses are taught in the evenings and weekends; some courses are offered online.

We have merit-based graduate assistantships and scholarships available each year to students interested in working with faculty or administration in the Department of Public Affairs and Social Research. In addition, many students admitted to the MPA program are eligible for some form of financial aid.
