APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS AND APPLICATION/2007-2008 Fiscal Year

(Applications processed between Aug. 1, 2007, and June 1, 2008)

The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund (SBMEF) is the national scholarship fund of the American Business Women's Association (ABWA). ABWA is an organization that provides business information and career development opportunities to a national network of working women and business owners throughout every stage of their careers. The Association also offers a program for student members. With approximately 40,000 members and 1,000 local chapter and Express Networks nationwide, ABWA helps women gain a lifetime of professional advancement and personal growth.

SBMEF was established to help women secure the education needed to achieve their business and professional goals. The fund is named in memory of the son of ABWA founder Hilary A. Bufton Jr. and Ruth H. Bufton. Since its inception in 1953, SBMEF has awarded more than \$15 million to fund the education of women.

This form provides the scholarship guidelines, candidate eligibility requirements and procedures for submitting an SBMEF application. To apply, complete this form in full (application on reverse) and attach all required supplemental materials. Return the application and attachments to the ABWA chapter/Express Network that you wish to sponsor you.

Scholarship Guidelines:

- The maximum grant amount awarded for each student is \$1,500 per year.
- Each grant awarded is for one academic year and is not automatically renewable. Recipients may apply for funding in subsequent years as long as they meet eligibility requirements.
- Funds awarded may be used only for tuition, books and fees. In the event that the applicant receives full funding of tuition, the funds must be returned to SBMEF.
- The SBMEF Board of Trustees (ABWA National Board of Directors) serves as the selection board for awarding all grants.
- Checks for grants awarded are made payable to the educational institution the applicant will be attending.
- Outright grants are not to be repaid.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements:

Those eligible to apply for SBMEF funding are women who:

- are citizens of the United States;
- are <u>at least</u> at the sophomore level in college (completed 45 credit hours or more) when applying for funds to be used the following year (when 60 or more credit hours have been completed);
- are sponsored by an ABWA chapter/network, although they do not have to be a member of the sponsoring chapter/network or of the Association.
- have achieved a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- are seeking a baccalaureate degree or higher.
- are applying to an institution authorized to confer degrees at the baccalaureate level or higher in the United States or its
 possessions, territories or districts.

Procedures for applying:

- 1. Obtain an official SBMEF application for the current year from the chapter/Express Network you would like to sponsor you and carefully review the scholarship guidelines and eligibility requirements.
- 2. Complete the SBMEF candidate application form in full.
- 3. Attach official transcripts of all college-level coursework, including grades.
- 4. Attach three current letters of reference from individuals who are not related to you.
- 5. Attach a short biographical sketch, no longer than one typed page, labeled with your name at the top. The sketch may include information about your background, school activities, outside interests, honors and awards, work experience, community service, etc. Also, describe your short- and long-term goals.

eligibility requirements and procedures.
Candidate must complete in full the Connections Chapter Special Scholarship Application.
Candidate must provide a short biographical sketch (one typed page, labeled with her name at the
top). The sketch must include career objectives in applicant's field of study and any information
that would have a bearing on the application.
Candidate must provide an official transcript. (No Internet copies, photocopies, or student copies
accepted)
Candidate must provide three current letters of reference from persons other than relatives.
Candidate sends the application and all supporting documents together in one envelope to: SBMEF/
ABWA National Headquarters, 9100 Ward Parkway, PO Box 8728, Kansas City, MO 64114-0728
Application deadline is March 28, 2008 and must be received by that date to be considered.

SBMEF administrator verifies the application and forwards it to the Trustees who serve as the selection board. The winner will be notified in May. The check will be mailed to the Connections Chapter president for presentation to the winner. To receive a list of chapter special scholarship winners, send a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your request to the address above.
