The Master of Arts degree in History and Political Thought gives you a variety of opportunities for career growth and intellectual enrichment. You may choose to specialize in History or Political Science or we offer a degree plan with 18 semester hours in each to make you qualified to teach both subjects in a junior or community college. The M.A. degree provides additional content training for teachers, preparation for more advanced graduate work to those desiring a Ph.D., and skills to professionals in public service and business. Our M.A. Program in History and Political Thought allows for wide-ranging preparation in many content areas as well as specific guided research through course assignments and the master's thesis.

Our history and political science faculty offer a diverse number of courses covering topics in International Relations, Comparative Politics; Political Philosophy; United States, Mexican, Latin American, European, and World History; and political science from ancient times to the 21st Century. You not only learn about the scholarly traditions of History and Political Science, but also receive practical training in research, writing, and critical thinking skills. Graduates will find that their M.A. degree in History and Political Thought prepares them for new challenges intellectually and professionally.

Texas A&M International University's Master of Arts degree in History and Political Thought offers you the opportunity to gain wide-ranging knowledge in a variety of historical and political science disciplines as well as targeted study in specific subjects of your interest. Moreover, we have a new Computer Aided Telephone Interview (CATI) laboratory that makes Political Science survey research a major opportunity for both original research and valuable future job skills.
