THESIS GUIDELINES SPECIFIC TO

M.A. THESES WRITTEN IN SPANISH

- 1. The Title Page and the Approval Page will follow the format of the sample pages in the Thesis Manual.
- 2. The abstract will appear in both Spanish and English; Spanish and English versions will have identical page numbers. Abstract will come first, then Resumen.
- 3. The dedication may be in English or Spanish or both. Dedication is limited to one page.
- 4. Acknowledgments will appear in English, with the option of a Spanish version as well. Spanish and English versions will have identical page numbers. Acknowledgments will come first, then Agradecimientos.
- 5. Ordering of contents (listing of preliminary pages in the Table of Contents is optional)
 - Abstract (page number iii)
 - Resumen (page number iii)
 - Dedication (optional)
 - Acknowledgments
 - Agradecimientos
 - etc.
- 6. The vita will be in English or a combination of English and Spanish. Vita is limited to one page.
- 7. Endnotes may appear at the end of each chapter, numbered consecutively within each chapter.
- 8. There will be one overall reference section after the last chapter. *PMLA* is usually the journal model, but other journals are acceptable.
- 9. Thesis Manual requirements will be followed for all other requirements.
