

# Basic Spin Search

**Step 1:** Log on to [www.infoed.org](http://www.infoed.org).

**Step 2:** Click on the **SPIN** button in the upper right-hand corner of your screen.




**Step 3:** Type a word or phrase into the **Quick Search** text box.

**Step 4:** Click on the **Search** button.

**Step 5:** Select the programs you are interested in by clicking on the box to the left of the program title.


