COLLEGE ADVISING INFORMATION

Advising is a distinct part of a student's educational experience. Discussions between the student and the college advisor should assist in exploring and clarifying education, career, and life goals. Students should consult with their college advisor before making decisions that may affect academic progress and success. Discussions with the college advisor may include: career decisions, TAMIU resources, dropping a class, withdrawing from school, selecting courses, and understanding degree requirements.

Course selection advising is required before registration for each semester or summer session, unless the student has an approved Petition for Web Registration Access signed by their college advisor on file in the Office of the University Registrar. These forms may be completed at any time in the student's career after 12 semester credit hours have been earned at TAMIU and submitted for approval.

New Transfer Students

Transfer students must call for an appointment with an advisor in the Office of the University Registrar at 956-326-2217. Your transfer work and degree audit will be reviewed with you; you may then be sent to see an advisor in the college of your major. Appointments must be made prior to April 30.

Continuing Students

Continuing Students may register in person or through the web if qualifications are met. Web registration qualifications may be found with the web registration information on the next page.

Person to Person Registration

1. Activate your file for the semester.
Visit the Office of the University Registrar in KL168 to obtain a registration form and have your status checked. Complete an address change form if needed. If you have holds, visit the offices indicated to get holds waived or cleared for fall. All holds must be cleared or waived before going to your college for advising. Obtain a copy of your degree audit.
2. Plan your course registration using your degree audit and the semester schedule booklet.
Use the Planning Schedule on page 5.
3. See your college advisor.
See the advising information on the next page.
Complete Section III of your Registration Form with your college advisor. Your college advisor will need to sign your form.
4. Courses need to be entered on the student information system (SIS).
Three options to enter your courses: your college advisor, the administrative assistant in the department of your major, or staff in the Office of the University Registrar.

You should receive the following after course entry: the yellow copy of your registration form, a printout of your schedule, and a copy of the tuition & fees due for the semester.
5. Check your Degree Audit on the web.
Be sure the courses for which you have registered apply to your degree program. Financial Aid will not pay for courses that are not applicable to your degree plan (including repeated courses).
6. Pay tuition and fees.
Summer I and Summer Long Session tuition and fees are due by June 3; Summer II by July 7. You may pay in person at the Cashier windows in Killam or use the credit card payment option on LASSO.
7. Have ID card made or validated.

8. Purchase books in the Bookstore at the Student Center.
9. Purchase Parking Permit.
Purchase parking permit at the Cashier window or in the University Police Department offices at Killam 005.

WEB REGISTRATION

Minimum requirements to be eligible to participate in Web Registration
Note: additional requirements may be established by individual departments.

1. Complete TSI requirement;
2. Be at least a second semester student at A&M International in designated program (undergraduate, graduate);
3. Earned at least 12 semester credit hours if undergraduates, including transfer work;
4. Be enrolled in a major offered by the College of Arts and Sciences or the College of Business.
5. Have all Holds cleared or waived by the appropriate department (holds can be checked on the Web).
6. Sign and follow process for Petition for Web Registration Access-Lasso approval.

Web Registration Steps

1. Access the web site at www.lasso.tamui.edu.
2. Select Login to Student Services. Note: do not use "back" button at the top of the screen while inside the LASSO program, as this will take you out. Instead, use the buttons at the bottom of each screen.
3. Enter student ID number (SSN or CWID) and PIN, then click on login. PIN for first time login is your birth date in this format: MMDDYY. Change your PIN after first login.
4. Activate your file for the semester. Check and update your mailing address and e-mail address. Print out a degree audit. Check your registration status for any holds that may need to be waived or cleared.
5. Select courses using your degree audit, the semester schedule booklet and the online course availability information. Fill in the registration work sheet.
6. Follow instructions on screen to check for class availability, to register for classes and to print a copy of your schedule and fees. Holds must be waived or cleared before registration will occur. Course pre-requisites may require approval from department or college advisor.
7. Pay tuition & fees on line with a credit card are in person as above.
8. ID Card, book purchase and parking permit obtained in person as above.

Admissions

All prospective Texas A&M International University undergraduate and graduate students must meet admission standards and requirements outlined in the current catalog. Students should apply for admission as soon as possible by calling, writing or visiting:

Qualified High School Students entering the 11th or 12th grade may seek early enrollment at A&M International for the purpose of gaining credits in University-level classes. To be concurrently enrolled, the high school junior or senior must complete the application process, have at least an 85 average (on a scale of 100) for all coursework completed in high school, and have written permission from the high school counselor. A special application must be completed. For further information, contact the Admissions Office at 326-2206.

Note: High School Students who have failed a section of THEA may not take college level classes related to portions of the test that have not been passed. For information, contact the Office of Programs for Academic Support and Enrichment (PASE) at 326-2134.

RETURNING TEXAS A&M INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Students who have not been enrolled in the past year must update their application at the Admission's Office.

Former students who have completed an undergraduate degree from A&M International and want to enroll in another program must complete a graduate application at the Admissions Office.

Students wanting to change majors must contact the Registrar's Office to request a change of major.

Texas Success Initiative (formerly TASP)

Students who are not exempt and have not passed all sections of the appropriate test must enroll in developmental courses and see a Developmental Education advisor. Advisors are located in the following offices: KL 318 (Ms. Hickey), KL 203 (Testing Center), KL 205B (CASA), KL 218 (Writing Center).

Tutoring Services

The Center for the Advancement of Scholastic Achievement, CASA, offers tutoring for most subjects other than writing. Tutoring is available from Sunday to Friday, including evening hours. For more information call 326-2723 or visit KL 205.

The Writing Center provides individual and group tutoring sessions, peer review sessions and writing workshops to help students develop their written English skills. For more information call 326-2883 or visit KL 218.

Deposit Fee

Students will be assessed a one time \$10.00 deposit fee for the duration of their studies at A&M International. This fee will cover any loss, damage, or breakage caused by the student and shall be returned, upon request, at the time of withdrawal or graduation.

Identification Cards

Identification cards are issued at each student's first registration and must be validated immediately after payment of fees each semester at the Registrar's Office. A fee of \$6.00 will be assessed for the ID card and for each replacement card. ID cards remain the property of A&M International and must be returned to the Registrar's Office upon demand.

Bacterial Meningitis Notification

In accordance with Chapter 51 of the Texas Education Code, Section 51.9191 and Chapter 38 of the Texas Education Code, Section 38.0025, all public institutions of higher education are required to notify all new students about Bacterial Meningitis. Important information about Bacterial Meningitis may be obtained at the Registrar's Office.

Payment of Tuition and Fees

Students are expected to pay all financial obligations to the University when due. Failure to meet such obligations will result in a student's record being placed on a hold status and may result in the student not being able to take final examinations, receive official transcripts, or enroll for another semester.

Please Note: Registration for classes will not be automatically cancelled due to non-payment. If you decide not to take classes you must call or go by the Registrar's Office.

Payment Deadlines:

Summer I & Summer Long Session June 2
Summer II Session July 7

If delaying payment beyond deadline above, you must complete a "Request for Delay of Payment".

Payment Options:

1. Cash or Check

2. Visa, Mastercard, American Express, Discover are accepted subject to verification with the BankCard Center. May use the credit card payment option thru LASSO on the web.

3. Financial Aid Awards will be reflected on tuition/fee bills for students who meet the April 30 deadline for Summer I/Summer Long Session or the May 31 deadline for Summer II processing requirements. Students who have not been awarded a financial assistance package by these dates and are in need of assistance are encouraged to apply for an Emergency Loan.

4. Emergency Loans are available on a first-come-first-serve basis as funds are available. Applications will be accepted beginning April 5 for Summer I/Summer Long Session and June 28 for Summer II. Students must register before the application can be processed. Applications will not be processed for any student with an outstanding balance on a previous loan. A \$10.00 processing fee will be added to each loan at the time of application.

Parking Fee

The parking fee will be added at the time of payment of tuition and fees if requested. All cars on campus must be registered with the Campus Police office.

Late Fee

Students who register after the close of General Registration will be assessed a \$25.00 late fee.

Waitlist Policy

Student may request to be waitlisted for a closed class. If space becomes available, waitlisted students will be added in the order the requests were received without prior notification to the student. It is the student's responsibility to check his/her status in the course. Requesting to be waitlisted makes the student liable for all tuition and fees due if a space becomes available. If the waitlisted class is no longer desired, a drop must be processed by the student. Please note: a student may not be waitlisted for one section of a course and be registered in another section of the same course.

Tuition Exemptions

Texas Veterans who no longer qualify for Federal VA Education Benefits or the benefits are less than the Hazelwood benefits should contact the Registrar's Office to inquire about possible eligibility for the Hazelwood tuition exemption as soon as possible. Application and other required submission must be completed by the census date of the session or semester it is to be invoked.

Senior Citizen Tuition Exemption: Senior citizens age 65 or older may have up to six hours of tuition fees waived a semester. Normal admission and registration procedures must be followed and course prerequisites met. To obtain the exemption, present a valid Texas driver's license or other valid ID showing date of birth to the Business Office. All other fees will be charged.

Tuition and Fee Exemption for Blind/Deaf Students.

This is a mandatory exemption program providing for a waiver of payment of tuition and all fees, except those related to lodging, board or clothing.

Student must provide Registrar with certification of blind or deaf condition from the Texas Rehabilitation Commission, Texas Commission for the Blind, or Texas Commission for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired.

Refund of Fees

Students dropping a course but still enrolled at the University may request a 100% refund of tuition and fees until the 4th University class day of the session involved (June 10 or July 15). After the 4th University class day, there is no refund for dropped classes.

Students withdrawing officially from the University (withdrawing from all courses) may request a refund of tuition and refundable fees according to the following scale, as specified by SB 604:

- 100% prior to the first University class day;
- 80% during the first, second or third University class day;
- 50% during the fourth, fifth, or sixth University class day;
- No refund during the seventh class day or thereafter.

Please note that refunds are based on university class days, not on the number of days a particular class has met.

A Refund Request form must be completed in the Registrar's Office for refunds based on drops or withdrawals.

Student Records:

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

Also known as FERPA, this act affords students certain rights with respect to their educational records. For more information, refer to the University catalog or click on Student Records at www.tamui.edu/affairs/registrar.

Candidates for August Graduation:

1. Pick up "Graduation Application" from the Office of the University Registrar, KL 168.

2. Complete all applicable items on the "Graduation Application" and submit to the Office of the Registrar no later than May 5. Forms and/or fees submitted after that deadline may not be processed in time for the applicant's name to appear in the graduation announcement. Graduation fee is \$20 as of January 2004.

3. Applications for students applying for masters degrees will be reviewed for completion of requirements and forwarded to the appropriate department chair or coordinator for approval. The application is not complete until this approval is granted.

4. Application for graduation is not transferable to a subsequent semester. If the student does not graduate, the application will be canceled. A new application must then be filed at the Office of the Registrar for the new date of graduation. Graduation fee for diploma may be transferred to the new term.

Teacher Education

Admission to the Learner-Centered Field Based Program in the College of Education requires screening in the areas of reading, oral and written communication, critical thinking and mathematics.

To be admitted to the Program, candidates must:

1. have an overall grade point average of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale.
2. have passing scores on all portions of the Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) with minimum scores of 260 in Reading, 240 in Mathematics, and 240 in Writing. The COMPASS, SAT, ACT or GRE may also be used to satisfy the THEA requirement.
3. have a passing score on the SPEAK test of English oral proficiency.

Veteran's Information

Students who wish to be certified to the VA are reminded to contact the VA clerk in the Registrar's Office as soon as courses are selected. VA CERTIFICATION IS NOT AUTOMATIC. For more information, call 326-2254.

International Students

The University requires each international student to have mandatory health insurance coverage while in the U.S.A. You should enroll in the University plan, Associated Insurance Plans International, Inc. (see website www.a-i-p-i.com). The University plan will cost approximately between \$700 to \$900 per year. This coverage is the same for all Texas A&M University System schools. You can enroll once arriving on campus or by phone at: 1-800-452-5772.

You must provide evidence of comparable policy coverage that must at least meet all of these requirements: 1) Basic Benefit coverage: \$50,000 per accident or illness, or Basic Benefits and Major Medical coverage: \$1,000,000 per accident or illness; 2) Repatriation of remains: \$3,000; 3) Medical evacuation: \$10,000; and 4) Maximum deductible per individual of \$100 or \$300 per family, per policy year. All request for substitutions for the university coverage must include an English translation of the policy from the insurance company.

Immigration documents such as passport, I-94 and I-20 ID must be carried at all times. This is in compliance with the Immigration and Nationality Act, December 24, 1952, Section 264(e).

Payment of registration fees is due in full at the time of registration.

Language Proficiency Program/ University Writing Assessment

All undergraduate students will take the *University Writing Assessment* after completion of English 1301 and 1302 as stipulated in their degree plan. This exam consists of writing an argumentative essay.

Students who passed English 1301 during Fall 1995 thru Summer 1997 at A&M International are not required to take the *University Writing Assessment* as they have met the language proficiency requirement through the department exam at that time.

Core Curriculum

At Texas A&M International University, the Core Curriculum introduces students to academic disciplines which form the foundation of human thought: mathematics, science, history, language, literature, the arts, and social and behavioral sciences. Our Core is conceived to open new areas of learning for our students and to foster skills necessary for success in higher education.

These requirements must be met by every student pursuing a baccalaureate degree at A & M International, regardless of his or her major. A specific course may be used to satisfy only one core requirement. Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum to satisfy particular degree requirements. Students may be required to take extra courses if they fail to select these courses.

A student who successfully completes a 42- to 48-semester-credit-hour core curriculum at a state-assisted institution of higher education in Texas may transfer that block of courses to TAMIU. The student will receive academic credit for each of the courses transferred. A student transferring to TAMIU who has not completed the core curriculum will be required to complete his or her core curriculum as specified by TAMIU.
