

The Center for Advancement of Scholastic Achievement (CASA) provides an academically focused, student-centered, supportive environment for students at Texas A&M International University by providing quality comprehensive academic support services to TAMIU students with the goal of supporting the University's mission for student success.



Student visits to CASA increased 18.44% from 11,266 in fiscal year 2007 to 13,343 in fiscal year 2008. The number of tutoring sessions at CASA increased 21.06% from 7161 in fiscal year 2007 to 8669 in fiscal year 2008.



Writing Center student visits increased 42% from 7693 in 2007 to 10,945 in 2008. Additionally, the number of Writing Center tutoring sessions increased 49% from 4264 in 2007 to 6361 in 2008.
