<u>Description</u>: This class serves as to prepare students to present recitals at the senior level and beyond. Focused on the creation of programs, development of repertoire to performance standard, and working towards a full length recital, student will, under supervision of faculty, prepare and present a public performance of 30 – 45 minutes of music. Students also learn the essentials of recital management (including publicity, preparation of program book, and development of written program notes).

Course Objectives

- Provide students with opportunity to develop performance skills and practices
- Provide students with the experience of presenting a 30 45 minutes recital
- Provide students with the experience of working collaboratively with accompanist / others to prepare music for performance
- Provide a forum for feedback on musical progress

Learning Outcomes

Students completing this course will:

- Present a 30 45 minutes of music in public recital
- Develop concert program publicity materials
- Prepare written program notes
- Know proper concert etiquette and deportment
- Gain experience in collaborative development of a concert program with accompanist / other musicians
- Develop more disciplined practice skills

Attendance Policy: Attendance requirements are listed in the TAMIU Student Handbook.

<u>Concert Attendance</u>: Students will be required to attend a number of different concerts being presented on the campus of Texas A&M International University prior to presenting their recital. A critique of these concerts will be a part of the discussion with supervising faculty the following week.

<u>Writing Assignments</u>: Each student must prepare concise and accurately researched program notes for each piece of music being presented in the recital. Student will show draft of research to faculty, and be advised as the information to be presented in the final draft of the program notes.

Exams: Recital will serve as exam.

Grading:

Preparation of musical program 10%
Collaboration with other musicians 20%
Preparation of printed materials (inc. Program notes) 30%
Performance 40%
