- 3. MATH Elective: 3 SCH selected from any math course above the level of College Algebra.
- 4. Second Romance Language: 6 SCH selected from the same Romance Language (French, Latin, or Portuguese).
- 5. Communications Major: 33 SCH including COMM 3322, 3325, 3327, 3329, 4320, 4324, 4333, 4340, 4350 and 4360, plus 3 SCH from any other COMM course.
- 6. Spanish Major: 33 SCH including SPAN 3300, 3305 and 3310, plus 24 SCH from any other upper division [3000-4000 level] courses in SPAN.
