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CERTIFICATE IN INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP

Purpose

The Certificate in International Leadership is intended to foster development of leadership skills among students from a variety of disciplines through academic instruction, community service and interaction with role models who exhibit leadership in various venues and circumstances.

Rationale

TAMIU's international focus that brings together students and faculty from around the globe, along with the university's unique location on the US/Mexico border, provides a unique opportunity for students to discover and enhance their leadership skills in a setting that foreshadows the demands of the 21st Century community and workplace. In all degree fields, students' potential for success will be enhanced through the intentional building of leadership skills. Through offering the opportunity to all students to develop the ability to lead, the university will graduate students fully prepared to become leaders in their chosen fields, in their community, in the state of Texas and in the national and international arena.

This Certificate in International Leadership will be useful in terms of personal development, potential career opportunities and contribution to the complex issues of the 21st Century.

Summary of Program

The Certificate in International Leadership consists of 6 sch from approved classes listed below, 3 sch in an introductory Foundations of Leadership course and 3 sch in the International Leadership capstone course; additional requirements are the successful completion of one service learning course connected to a for credit class including submission of an essay that links that experience to leadership development and documentation of 40 or more hours of community service (in addition to the service learning experience). The community service may be in conjunction with membership in a student organization.

Learning Outcomes

Cognitive

Upon completion of the Certificate in International Leadership, the student will:

Be able to communicate effectively with those from multiple cultural and demographic backgrounds.

Demonstrate the ability to solve complex problems with creative approaches (critical thinking)

Affective

Explain diverse approaches to and definitions of leadership. Link the experience of serving others to the enhancement of leadership skills. Link understanding of self to leadership ability.

Means of Assessing Student Learning Outcomes

- Assessment will be conducted through a pretest in the introductory Foundations of Leadership course and a posttest in the capstone course. The capstone course will include presentation of a portfolio reflecting the work completed toward the certificate, graded with a rubric for purposes of assessing the learning outcome achievement.

Criteria for Admission

The student must:

- have completed at least 30 of 42 sch core curriculum and have at least sophomore standing.
- be working toward any academic major at TAMIU
- submit an application for admission to the Binational Center

Criteria for Earning the Certificate:

- successfully complete a minimum of four required courses noted below.
- attain at least a 2.75 GPA in the selected leadership courses with no less than a C in any course.
- Present a portfolio of work completed to the Binational Center in conjunction with the capstone course.

Approved Courses

Each 3-credit course has been selected based on its context and relevancy for fostering understanding of the identified learning outcomes. It is not an exclusive list. Other courses that address the learning outcomes may be substituted with approval of the Binational Center advisor and the instructor offering the course. The introductory Foundations of Leadership course and the capstone course cannot be substituted.

Administration of the Certificate

The certification is housed at in the Binational Center which helps design and implement educational initiatives throughout the world. It translates the regional experience of the faculty back into TAMIU curriculum in an effort to internationalize the educational experience of students. The Certificate program itself is a product of the University Leadership Initiative Committee. Assessment of the certificate program will be the responsibility of BINC in collaboration with participating faculty and the Director of the PROF Center. Modifications to the certificate program will be approved by the University Leadership Initiative Committee and the University Curriculum Committee.

Certificate in International Studies New Catalog

This Certificate is intended for undergraduate students in various disciplines who are interested in pursuing careers in the foreign service, international institutions, non-governmental international organizations and multinational corporations as well as those who recognize the importance, in any career field, of understanding international issues.

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of the Certificate, students will be able to

Explain the main problems faced by the world in terms of their origins, impacts, and potential solutions.

Identify the various differences and similarities that shape the ways countries embark on their quest for growth and development.

Analyze conceptual frameworks used to understand the history and evolution of the globalization process.

Criteria for Admission: a student must have completed 60 or more semester hours of coursework, be accepted into an established academic major at TAMIU and submit an application for the CIS program to the Binational Center.

Criteria for Earning the Certificate: a student must complete a minimum of four approved courses with a 2.75 or higher GPA in the selected courses and no less than a C in any course, and participate in a focus group scheduled by the Binational Center after completion of the required CIS courses, generally the student's last semester before graduation. .
