SPAN 1311 (SPAN 1311) Introductory Spanish for Non-Native Speakers I: Three semester hours plus one hour lab. (FL) An oral and written introduction to Spanish for students with no previous knowledge of the language. The course emphasizes the need to acquire an ear for the sound of Spanish and an introduction to the language's grammatical structures. This is the first part of a two-part introduction to Spanish. Three hours plus one hour lab. **Departmental placement exam required.** 

**Justification**: For a number of years, TAMIU students have received credit for six (6) Spanish credit hours (equivalent to SPAN 1311 and SPAN 1312) by scoring 50+ on the CLEP test. Those who score 49 or less have typically enrolled in SPAN 1311 with little or no advising. As a result, both "native" (heritage language learners) and "non-native" learners (L2 learners) enroll in SPAN1311. Since heritage language learners (HLLs) have different pedagogical needs than L2 Spanish learners (Valdés,1997; Parodi, 2008; Martínez, 2003; Silva-Corvalán, 2001), neither group benefits from a generic class.

To ameliorate this situation, an in-house Spanish placement test will be required for all students who wish to take SPAN1311. This test will distinguish between HL and L2 learners, and it will also measure different skill levels, thus facilitating student placement into the appropriate course options.
