NFNP 5509 Management of Acute and Chronic Illness, Part 2 Five semester hours, three theory, six clinical.

This course builds on the advanced knowledge and skills acquired in Wellness and Health Promotion and Management of Acute and Chronic Illness, Part 1. The focus is on developing advanced practice skills in the management of individuals with acute and chronic disorders of selected body systems. Emphasis is on addressing care of unstable and complex health care problems through synthesis and prioritization of historical and immediately derived data. The student critically evaluates clinical guidelines for prevention as well as treatment, and participates in the delivery of care to individuals and families from varying cultures with an emphasis on the financial aspects of primary health care delivery. Prerequisites: NFNP 5305, NFNP 5406, NFNP 5407.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Select high quality, cost-effective treatment modalities in the use of health care resources. (1, 5)
- 2. Integrate knowledge of relevant legal regulations for nurse practitioner practice including reimbursement of services. (5)
- 3. Demonstrate fiscal accountability for one's own practice while providing quality care. (5, 6)
- 4. Evaluate access, cost, efficacy, and quality when making care decisions. (4, 5)
- 5. Treat common acute and chronic physical and mental illnesses and common injuries in people of all ages to minimize the development of complications, and promote functional outcomes and quality of life. (1, 2)
- 6. Evaluate results of interventions using accepted outcome criteria and evidence-based practice to revise the plan accordingly, and consult/refer when needed. (2, 3, 4)
- 7. Educate patients for self-management of acute/chronic illness with sensitivity to the patient's learning ability and cultural/ethnic background. (2, 4)
- 8. Recognize acute exacerbations of chronic illness and intervene appropriately while attending to the patient's response to the illness experience. (2)
- 9. Integrate appropriate nonpharmacologic treatment modalities into a plan of care. (2)
- 10. Adapt care to meet the special needs of women and children experiencing acute and chronic health conditions. (1, 2, 5)
- 11. Assess, diagnose, monitor, coordinate, and manage the health/illness status of patients over time and support the patient through the end-of-life process. (2, 4)
- 12. Collaboratively assess, plan, implement, and evaluate primary care with members of the interdisciplinary team using approaches that recognize each one's expertise to meet the comprehensive needs of patients. (1, 2, 4, 5)
- 13. Schedule follow-up visits to appropriately monitor patients and evaluate the response to health/illness care. (2, 4)
