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NFNP 5612 Integrated Clinical Practicum

Six semester hours, one theory, fifteen clinical.

This capstone course builds on advanced knowledge and concepts from Wellness and Health Promotion and Management of Acute and Chronic Illness, parts 1 and 2 and the practica for each course. The emphasis is on continued study of assessment and clinical management of selected health problems. The clinical portion provides for the development of clinical competence as the student integrates previously acquired knowledge into the enactment of the multiple roles of the nurse practitioner, and allows for a greater degree of interdependent practice based on the student's abilities and progress. The student works with one or more preceptors in multicultural urban and rural community settings. Prerequisite: NFNP 5608 and NFNP 5509.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Deliver health care services in a variety of delivery settings, including acute and ambulatory care delivery systems, and managed and integrated care systems. (2)
- 2. Select high quality, cost-effective choices in the use of health care resources. (3, 5, 6)
- 3. Plan and incorporate strategies to help patients with health care problems regain stability and restore health in collaboration with the patient and interdisciplinary health care team. (1, 2, 4, 5)
- 4. Evaluate results of interventions using accepted guidelines and outcome criteria, revise the plan accordingly, and consult/refer when needed. (1, 3, 4, 5, 6)
- 5. Assist the patient and/or caregiver to access the resources necessary for care. (1, 2)
- 6. Build and maintain an interdisciplinary health care team to provide optimum service. (2, 4)
- 8. Obtain specialist and referral care for patients while remaining the primary care provider. (2, 4)
- 9. Initiate appropriate and timely consultation and/or referral when the problem exceeds the nurse practitioner's scope of practice and/or expertise. (3, 5, 6)
