<u>JUSTIFICATION</u>: Minor edits are attached for a number of course descriptions in Art History, made to reflect more accurately how the teaching goals of the courses have evolved over recent years. In one case, prerequisites are adjusted; in another, the course name has changed (but not the number). In the latter case, 4-year-plan and minor descriptions are also appended, since the change in the course name will require those two documents to be modified slightly. ## Course Description Changes:

ARTS 1304 (ARTS 1304) Art History Survey: Renaissance to Modern. Three semester hours. A basic introduction to painting, sculpture, architecture and other media from the fifteenth to the mid twentieth twentieth century, including some brief coverage of nonwestern cultures. The goal of the course will be to understand art in relation to its traditions of use, meaning, and technique within specific cultures and historical settings.

ARTS 3310 Studies in World Art of the Early Modern Era. Three semester hours.

Features study of the arts of selected cultures, periods, themes, and artists in a range of European, American, and non-Western settings during the early modern era. Renaissance and Baroque Europe; Postelassie Mesoamerican Art; the Late Intermediate Period of the Andes; ancient native American cultures of the North American southern plains and greater southwest; Native American Art; Ancient Greek or Roman Art; Spanish Colonial and Republican-era Latin America all represent possible sources for topics. Prerequisites: ARTS 1301, 1303 or 1304, or consent of instructor. May be repeated once when topic changes.

ARTS 3330 Eighteenth and Nineteenth Century Art. Three semester hours.

Selected areas of study in the arts of Europe and North America from about 1680 1660 to about 1860. The evolving cultural and economic roles of art, artists, and audiences in the modern era will provide an organizing theme. Prerequisite: ARTS 1301 or 1304, or consent of instructor.

ARTS 3352 Modern Art, 1860-1970 1960. Three semester hours.

Selected areas of study concerning art, artists, audiences, and stylistic concepts from the beginnings of modernism to

ARTS 3353 Contemporary Art, 1970 to Present. Art since 1945. Three semester hours. Selected areas of study concerning movements, artists, and critical concepts associated with recent modern and contemporary art since the end of World War II. Prerequisite: ARTS 1301 or ARTS 1304; or consent of instructor. ARTS 3352 strongly recommended.
