MATRICULATION

- 1. Application: Submit an application form (available at KL 426) and a \$15.00 non-refundable fee for admission to the College of Education.
 - 2. Courses: Complete all core curriculum coursework with a grade of "C" or better.
- 3. WIN Courses: Complete at least one Writing Intensive course at the 1000-2000 level. (For students with less than 60 credit hours.)
 - 4. University Seminar: Complete two University Seminar courses (UNIV 1101 and 1102)

linked to education courses. Students who transfer in with 30 or more credit hours are exempt from the UNIV requirement.
