EDEC 4362 EDEL 3362

Language and Literacy for the Young Child WIN

Three semester hours. (FL/SP/SS-Odd)

This course provides an understanding of the underlying theoretical principles and developmental patterns related to language and literacy development in children. Research-based best practices in early elementary grade settings and authentic assessment of children's progress in literacy development is emphasized. The course also includes a supervised school-based service learning component. EDEL 3362 is designated as a "Writing Intensive" (WIN) course in which writing will play a central role in the learning process, and in which grades earned on written work will constitute a significant portion of the course grade. Prerequisites: PSYC 2314, Admitted to and in good standing in the College of Education. the acquisition of language and literacy. Authentic assessment of children's progress in literacy development is emphasized. Prerequisites: EDEC 2324, admission to the College of Education and 2.7 overall grade point average

Justification:

Previously an early childhood course (EC-4), this course continues as a required course in the new elementary education programs (EC-6) as well as the communication disorders program. Thus, the EDEL Prefix (elementary) replaces the EDEC prefix. As a foundational course emphasizing literacy development, the course is now numbered 3362 instead of 4362 to denote its earlier place in the course sequence for the academic major.

- (1) Candidates will describe the developmental processes involved in emergent literacy (i.e. reading, writing, fluency, vocabulary, phonemic awareness, and comprehension) from Pre-K through grade 6, as well as the contextual (classroom, individual, family, and cultural) factors that influence them.
- (2) Candidates will analyze a child's written and oral literacy products to determine the developmental level and make suggestions for scaffolding that child to continue in developing his/her literacy skills.
