Three semester hours

To be scheduled only with the consent of the Ph.D. Program Director and the COBA Graduate Advisor. Students must enroll for a minimum of 6 dissertation credit-hours per semester and maintain continuous enrollment subsequent to passing comprehensive examinations and admission to candidacy. No credit will be assigned until dissertation has been completed, successfully defended, and filed with the Ph.D. Program Director. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: Successful completion of all components of the Ph.D. Comprehensive Examination

New Description

BA 6399 Dissertation Research (3 semester credit hours)

This course will prepare Ph.D. students to write and defend a dissertation in the field of international business and specialty areas through completing a research project appropriate for a doctoral graduate. Students must maintain continuous enrollment after passing comprehensive examinations and admission to candidacy.

The prerequisite for the course is the successful completion of all components of the Ph.D. Comprehensive Examination. The course is graded as "In Progress." No credit will be assigned until dissertation has been completed, successfully defended, and filed with the Ph.D. Program Director.

The instructor of record is the Dissertation Chair.

- 2) Shows knowledge of the literature and methodology in the student's advanced specialty field.
- 3) Show evidence of the ability to communicate research findings.
