Justification: General misunderstanding has existed concerning whether SPAN 1620 can be taken to fulfill the COAS foreign language requirement. For example, some students have first taken the CLEP exam and received 6-credit hours for their university foreign language requirement, and subsequently enrolled in SPAN 1620, thinking that this would

fulfill their COAS foreign language requirement. Instead, students who receive credit by taking the CLEP should fulfill the COAS requirement by either taking six credit hours of sophomore level Spanish or six credits of a different foreign language at the introductory level (eg. Mandarin Chinese, French, or Portuguese). The addition of this new statement in the course description should curtail the occurrence of advising errors.

The new information will be added to the current course descriptions and read as follows:

SPAN 1620 Introductory Spanish for Non-Native Speakers I & II

Beginning Spanish (Non-Native Speakers)

Six semester hours plus one hour lab.

An intensive beginning Spanish course for non-native speakers. An oral and written introduction to Spanish for students with no previous knowledge of the language. The course emphasizes the need to acquire an ear for the sound of Spanish and an introduction to the language's grammatical structures. Cross-listed with SPAN 1311 and SPAN 1312. "SPAN 1620 will not fulfill the COAS Foreign Language/Study Abroad requirement if a student has already received 6 credit hours of introductory Spanish by having taken either the CLEP exam or AP high school courses."
