Freshman: Less than 30 semester hours of credit

Sophomore: Thirty to fifty nine (30-59) semester hours of credit*

Justification:

Upon completing the forty two (42) semester hours of credit of Texas's state-mandated Core Curriculum, students have typically fulfilled most prerequisites and proceed to the advanced coursework of their majors. Once a student is "core complete," all accredited institutions of higher education in the state will recognize this status. Thus, a higher classification for such students indicates their academic status more accurately. Since sixty (60) semester hours of credit represents the halfway point for most academic programs, students attaining this academic level will be classified as juniors regardless of whether the Core Curriculum has been completed.
