Graduate Admissions Formula*

To meet the minimum admissions requirement, the following formula is used:

(Upper Level GPA x 100) + GRE Verbal + GRE Quantitative

Applicants with formula scores above 660 will be fully admitted into their graduate program.

Applicants with formula scores between 659 and 575 will be admitted to their graduate programunder Probationary Admissions status.

Applicants with formula scores below 575 will be holistically reviewed by the department or program admissions committee.

All other admissions to graduate programs is through departmental or college/school admission committees. The student's entire record will be considered including the completed application for admission, undergraduate overall GPA, upper level GPA, GPA in the discipline, a student narrative, letters of recommendation, GRE or GMAT scores (evaluated in compliance with HB 1641), and professional and/or academic experience.
